6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Since our college is an affiliated college, the curriculum development is under the control of affiliating university. However, the faculty members who are the members of BOS of university give their suggestions to improve the curriculum on the basis of feedbacks obtained by the students as well as faculty members. Whenever there is a change in curriculum it is communicated to students and faculty as well.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Faculty members of the college use various innovative teaching-learning methods viz. class tests, assignments, poster presentation, group discussions, ppt etc along with the class-room lecture method. Students are encouraged to prepare articles or research papers in their subject and to publish them in local or regional magazines at their own to enhance their creativity, originality and analytical thinking.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination and evaluation processes are under the control of the affiliating university. Both methods are provided by the university and the same are communicated to the students and other institutional members. However, the institutional examination committee takes care of conduction of peaceful exams in the campus.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college encourages the teachers for research work. They are encouraged to attend and present research papers in seminars/ conferences/workshops and submit proposals for projects. They are also motivated to attend orientation and refresher courses organized by UGC to update their knowledge

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

For better practices of the students, the lectures are delivered through LCD projector, overhead projector and power point presentation. The students are encouraged to join the computer course running in the college by APTECH under Shikhar project of Govt. of Uttarakhand. In the current session 24 girls are registered in the project. The college has a well stocked library. After admission, girls can get books issued from the library which can be exchanged from time to time. For daily news and employment/ career information, students can use the daily news papers and magazines subscribed in the reading room of college. For practical knowledge related to the subject the institution tries to update all the labs as and when the funds are received.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The Principal assigns various portfolios to the faculty members. He takes meetings on regular basis, constitutes committees, issues circulars and interacts personally with the staff to know about the progress of work in different fields and also gives new assignments. He also monitors regularly that the adequate information is available for the proper management.





1- Title

Personality development of students maintaining balance between curricular and co-curricular aspects.

2- Goal

A cultured literate woman can educate the entire family as well as can be a part of social and national development. The college has the goal of having curricula enriched with co- curricular and extra- curricular activities and there by developing the skills and personality of girls so that they may be economically independent and socially responsible citizens .

3-Contexts

The college offers the courses in all the three faculties Arts, Science and Commerce providing the flexibility of selecting the subjects. For UG B.A. programme the students have the choice of selecting three subjects out of 9 subjects along with a compulsory subject either Hindi Language or English Language. It is compulsory for the students to study environmental education as a non credit qualifying course at the 2nd year of UG level. The college is also running a job oriented course –PG diploma in “Yoga and Alternative Therapy”.

To provide quality education the college has faculty who are Ph.D., M.Phil. and UGC/NET. Along with curricular activities, co- curricular and cultural activities are also organized to enrich the curriculum, to impart additional skills, to inculcate moral and civil values to sensitize the students towards social and environmental issues.

4-The Practice

- Academic schedule is well planned containing curricular, co-curricular and cultural activities.
- Apart from class room teaching, the students are given assignments, class tests, poster presentation, group discussion etc.
- 75% attendance in each class is compulsory.
- Slow learners and fast learners are identified during the class and are provided special attention according to their requirements.

- College has well stocked library and a reading room providing latest books, reference books, news papers, magazines, journals and periodicals.
- College has almost all indoor and outdoor sports facilities.
- All the departments have departmental associations who organize various academic and skilled activities like debates, slogan writing, essay writing, poem recitation, flower decoration etc.
