COURSE, PROGRAM OUTCOMES & PROGRAM SPECIFIC OUTCOMES OF MUSIC

B.A. in Hindustani Music (Vocal) Programme Outcomes

<u>PO1</u>. This course provides the basic ideas and concepts of Hindustani Music (Vocal).

<u>**PO2</u>**. Through this programme, students will get knowledge about Indian classical music. The course intends to orient the learner with the approaches to the discipline of Music Vocal.</u>

<u>PO3</u>. Through this course, the students will get to know the different Ragas, Taalas, basic science of Indian Music, notation system of Indian and Western Music, History of Indian Music, origin and development of Gharana tradition, Carnatic Sangeet, Folk Music of Uttarakhand along with the biographies of some distinguished artists and scholars of Indian Music.

<u>**PO4</u>**. Students will also get acquainted with the musical stage performance. Through the curriculum, students will get acquainted with the authentic aspects of historical facts and gain knowledge of the glory of Indian Music. Students will be motivated to contribute towards nation building by being aware of the Indian music and culture.</u>

<u>**PO5**</u>. This course will provide a medium for students to develop an aptitude for research. This curriculum will not only provide a bridge of performance ability to the students but also provide them employment opportunities.
