<u>COURSE, PROGRAM OUTCOMES & PROGRAM SPECIFIC</u> <u>OUTCOMES OF POLITICAL SCIENCE</u>

The undergraduate programme of Political Science aims at providing students with a conceptual foundation in the discipline, with an ability to critically analyze the on presence of the political thought. Through various courses, we shall examine the nature, distribution and dynamics of power- both at the macro level of national and international politics and also at the micro level of the individual, family and community. We will map the ways in which knowledge systems and challenges to particular power relations have been constructed over specific vectors of time and space. We will study Aristotle and Plato, Gandhi and Iqbal; complementing studies on cold war politics will be an exploration of party politics in South Asia. The relationship of theory and ethnography, quantitative and qualitative techniques, analysis of objective data and descriptive accounts will provide the background to our studies. Exploration of the field and data collection will be of vital importance as we seek to prepare a strong foundation in research methodology. Following Kumaun University's aim of covering the breadth of disciplines and exploring their interconnections, a student of political science will be encouraged to identify and pursue areas of interest that go beyond conventional disciplinary structure.

Programme Specific Outcomes:

PSO1: The students will be familiarized with the basic ideas of political science.

PSO2: The students will be familiarized with the concepts of political theory.

PSO3: The students will be able to understand and distinguish between basic concepts like political theory, political thought and political philosophy.

PSO4: The students will be able to understand and relate the concepts and facts with the political realities and the country and different parts of the world.

The students will be equipped with the basics of the discipline and learn the basic underpinnings of the subject of political science.

Programme Outcome:

PO1: In the Certificate course of first year, we offer the students following specific curriculum about developments in political philosophy and detailed knowledge about key concepts in political theory. The students will be able to follow contemporary debates on justice, freedom, democracy, and also to apply abstract theoretical arguments to practical situations.

PO2: The students will be able to understand the representation system and working of the institutions in modern democracies by studying elections and understanding trends. They will learn application of the knowledge to the field of electoral politics.

PO3: The students will be able to learn about environmental issues, organizations, treaties and protocols as well as about politics and environment relationships. They will be able to apply environmental regulations to real life problems.

PO4: The students will be able to learn about rural local self-government and administration in India. They will also get an understanding of the governance and policies in the rural context. They will be able to apply the knowledge to grass root level situations.

PO5: The students will be able to learn about evolution of Comparative Politics as a domain, its methods and theories with a focus on politics in different nations in a comparative perspective. They will be able to acquire skills to compare politics among nations. They will be able to apply the knowledge gained in understanding the politics of different nations and the political trends including area studies.
